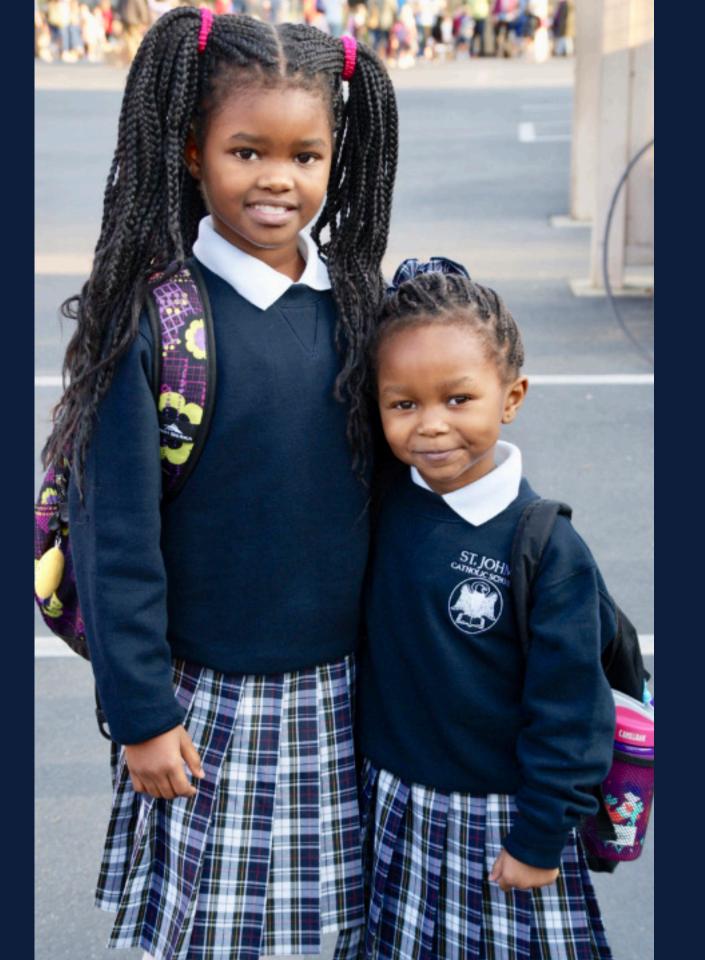


MISSION
