e walked and lived each line of that theme in the 2020-2021 school year. Parents, teachers, students, alumni and parishioners, witnessed the power of our community as together we cared for one another, prayed for one another and called on God to guide us through circumstances beyond our control. COVID may have disrupted the way we did 'regular' school, but it also gave rise to deeper and stronger community relationships. We no longer took our school, our colleagues, our students, and in-person time for granted. Together we planned, we acted and we persisted.

In this issue you won't find the traditional photos of all-school Masses, sports events, the annual middle school musical, Grandparents and Special Friends Day and after school clubs. Most, if not all, traditional events were cancelled or re-imagined in efforts to keep people safe. However, our year of community closeness while distanced was filled with new memories, live-streamed Masses, and virtual programs, such as music videos for Grandparents, *The Little Mermaid*, *Jr.*, Christmas programs, and a virtual auction. COVID forced us to deliver many of our traditions in new ways.

Classes and events were moved and redesigned. Jog-a-thon became a weeklong event as running groups became much smaller. Students created Stations of the Cross to display outside the church so we could pray together while apart. The eighth grade delivered a spirited Purple and Gold day, leading us all in outdoor fun. Lunch service went grab-and-go and was a treasured time for parent salutations. And speaking of drive-throughs, both the eighth grade celebration and the kindergarten graduation drive-throughs were successful, joyous events.

We lived our Gospel values. Students created lunches of love and hygiene bags for those served by the St. Vincent de Paul ministry. The Kids Heart Challenge raised over \$14K, and we continued to support our Unbound students. The parents supported the teachers and the staff with food, blankets, coffee, and gloves to keep us warm in the chilly ventilated classrooms. Treats from the community, Taco Del Mar, and Nutty Squirrel, helped fuel our teachers during this challenging time. Generous grants to the school, like those of the Fulcrum Foundation and the Seattle Foundation, and your giving through the Annual Fund, the Auction, and the Jog-a-thon helped us keep our staff and faculty employed, and allowed us to offer tuition assistance to families who were experiencing hardship due to the pandemic.

It was quite the year, but together we did it. We lived our mission and acted for the common good.


