Greetings St. John Community!



Beginning a new school year amid the challenges and unpredictability of the pandemic was a daunting task, but the community of St. John, united in spirit and action, forged ahead guided by our mission to be a Catholic community and to inspire moral development, academic excellence, and the courage to act for the common good.

The unwavering commitment of our faculty and staff resulted in increased enrollment for the 21-22 school year. COVID precautions and social distancing meant that we were spread throughout the campus with all hands-on deck. Even spread apart, we could feel the joy, warmth, and compassion that is synonymous with St. John. We manifested and lived the mission daily, striving for academic excellence while ensuring the health and

well-being of the community. We were fortunate to be able to hire two registered nurses who supported all of us throughout the year.

What a year it was! These pages show that even masked for part of the year, we were able to gather for events that are part of our St. John fabric. The Jog-a-thon was once again a fun three-day event, with over 1,000 miles (about the distance from Florida to New York City) run and over \$120,000 raised! Many students participated in CYO sports throughout the year, bringing home several trophies! In-person events, like the Middle School Musical, *Mary Poppins, Jr.*, the Auction and Grandparents and Special Friends Day were delightfully received. To culminate the year and celebrate all our achievements, we gathered for the end of the year BBQ, School's Out – Grills Out. Despite the 'atmospheric river', the community gathered. We had the biggest attendance ever!

Faculty, staff, and community members were busy! In addition to our regular responsibilities, we also began the self-study to renew accreditation with the Western Catholic Educational Association. The current six-year term ends in 2023. Accreditation promotes continuous improvement. The process includes completing a selfstudy using the National Standards and Benchmarks for Effective Elementary and Secondary Catholic Schools. Parents, students, community members and faculty were surveyed. Teams were formed, and they evaluated the benchmarks in the four domains; Governance and Leadership, Academic Excellence, Operational Vitality, and Catholic Identity. By the end of the school year, the first draft was completed and will be revised and edited in the 22-23 school year. It will be read by a team of principals and teachers chaired by a leader from outside Washington state. The visiting team will spend three days at the school in 2023 verifying that we are meeting the standards and offering feedback.

As we said goodbye to the Class of '22, we also said goodbye to Mrs. Tsagalakis, our beloved music teacher of 24 years, and Mrs. Dahlgren, our playground supervisor of 30 years. We are ever grateful to our St. John legends.




National History Day

*In May of 2020 the Parish and School received a forgivable Payroll Protection Plan Loan ("PPP Loan") of \$733,189. The School's portion of the PPP loan was \$688,797. In accordance with the rules of the CARES ACT, all forgivable loan proceeds were used to fund certain payroll expenses in the years ending June 30, 2020 and 2021. In November of 2021, after review by Bank of America and the Small Business Administration, the PPP loan was forgiven.

During the year ended June 30, 2022, the school received support from the Emergency Assistance to Non-Public Schools (EANS) program of \$211,516 which provided funding for qualified instructional and support costs. These resources and the surplus for the year ended June 30, 2022 contributed to cash reserves. In the coming year, cash reserves will be utilized to fund a new electric ventilation, heating, air conditioning and air filtration system for the school building. The budget for the new system is approximately \$1,650,000. Adequate cash reserves will remain after expenditure for the ventilation project. In addition, grant funds will be utilized to install increased ventilation and air conditioning in Quigley House.

Fund-a-Need contributions and proceeds from the Called to Serve as Christ Capital Campaign provided funding for a new fire alarm system and replacement of the bleachers in Egan Hall. The cost of these projects is \$235,000.
